We had many conversations about life and lessons that I had already learned on these road trips and some of these trips were very long!! God also gave me the opportunity to realize another dream of mine and that was to become "Miss Manitoba High School Rodeo". This really brought me out of my shell as I was to be a spokesperson for MHSRA and had to interact with people I did not know. The first responsibility I had was to represent Manitoba at the National High School Finals in Farmington, New Mexico, competing for Miss National High School Rodeo, This sure increased the workload for mom and dad and myself as we prepared to go down south for ten days of competition. I had also qualified to compete in pole bending and breakaway roping.....things were going to be busy!!! It was an awesome experience, one that made me a stronger, more confident person who now knew the value of hard work. A couple of years later, we headed down to the Nationals in Gillette, Wyoming, where I had the opportunity to compete in pole bending and breakaway roping. During all those years of rodeo I was never hurt, other than a sprained ankle (I wasn't even on or around a horse) and I am very thankful for the safety my horses and I experienced. I know a lot of that had to do with the prayers that dad was always praying.

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During my high school years I was really busy between school and my rodeo. I guess you could say I was a high achiever and wanted to do well both academically in school and on the rodeo grounds. If it weren't for my strong foundation in the Lord, I am not sure how well it all would have worked out with all the stresses that a busy life can bring and while trying to figure out who I was. I know that the Lord was there with me through all of the ups and downs, and as I remained faithful to Him, He did bless me in many awesome ways!!! In 2010, I graduated high school and while that was an exciting day it was also bittersweet, as I was leaving what I knew and my high school rodeo career. I applied for the Medical Radiology Technologist (X-ray) course which was offered about two to three hours away from home. I was accepted but with a 2-3 year wait. While I was there, I received news that I had been awarded one of the scholarships for the course and would be enrolled that fall. WOW, what a blessings that was, not only was I getting most of the course paid for, but it took a year or two off the waiting list. "GOD is faithful"!! I met a lot of great people at camp, many of which I am still close friends with. I also met a very special Godly man there.... one that dad approved of and we starting dating. REPORT FROM JOHN FITZHERBERT

Seems like to me that time has sped up. I find it hard to believe that summer is gone and fall is upon us. Combines and swathers are running everywhere. Around High River the crops are very good on average, some people had mediocre hay crops while others had a bumper crop of bales. It was because of spotty rain fall. Some got lots others got little. As I traveled around this summer I could see a lot of people where not blessed with rainfall at the right time. We went to a wedding in Saskatchewan and I thought the crops looked pretty good. I said this to a farmer and his reply was, "Don't walk out in it you will be disappointed." Rains have come since then but t00 late to help the crops although it sure has helped the pastures and makes everything look so much better.

Somebody built a new seniors in High River called Sunrise Village. I think it holds about two-hundred people. Every Sunday they have a local church or group come in and put on a service for whoever wants to come. They asked the Christian Cowboys if we would be able to come on the fourth Sunday of every month so that is what we did. It started very slow with only ten or twelve people coming to our service, but it is picking up, sometimes twenty come now. I have not been able to be there every time this summer due to being at a rodeo somewhere, but thank the Lord for other people who have filled in wonderfully.

About thirty years ago I held Cowboy Church in the village of Longview which is about four miles from my place, when they held their sports day that later on turned into a rodeo. I did it for a few years, then the local church took it over so I was not there for many years. This year the committee that runs the show asked if I would be able to do it again. It turned I had no other rodeo to go to that Sunday so I got a group together and we had Cowboy Church in Longview once again. There was only one person there who might have been at the first one, but I could no remember and neither could she. Sure was good to be back to all the familiar surroundings, my only regret was I don't think anyone got saved that morning.

It has been a busy summer going to the different places where the rodeos are, we can praise the Lord we didn't get rained out anywhere, but they sure had sloppy arenas in a few places but no rain on Sunday morning !!!

I knew a young man who was put on skates almost as soon as he could walk. His parents wanted him to be a professional hockey player. They didn't pay much attention to his schooling because they always had him at a hockey school or camp. They traveled thousands of miles to games and practices trying to make him a star player. He finally got old enough to play junior hockey for a team in the Western Hockey League. He played on a team that was eliminated in the first round of the playoffs. After that he was let go by that team and no other team picked him up. I don't know if he did not have the talent, the skills, the size or perhaps the desire to go further in a hockey career. He now works in the oil patch. What a disappointment this is for the parents with such high hopes for their son. I can identify with these people when I look at our children. I have traveled thousands of miles, worn out a bunch of vehicles going to sing and preach the gospel while our own children were not serving the Lord. I am a cowboy at heart. When I was fifteen years old my mom and dad were put in charge of the colony garden. I did not like that at all because it took some of my cowboy life away. At twenty years old the colony gave me the job to look after the potatoes. I sure did not want the job. I thought that will be it for my cowboy life because up until then my Dad and I used to ride and move cows just about every Saturday. Praise the Lord, He knows what He is doing!

I hurt my knee when I was twenty playing hockey. I went to the hospital and had an operation. I think it was just as bad as the one Bobby Orr had. The pain was so bad I could not sleep for two days. On the third night I called out to God while I was crying "Lord I can not bare this pain, will you help me ?" After about four minutes the door to my room opened and there was a flash of light. It went around my bed and then it was gone. Then a voice came loud and clear "Thou shalt be healed." I bent my knee ten times and the pain was all gone and I slept through the night. When I got up the next day I counted my stitches and they were all there. I got my crutches and hopped all over. Even the hospital food tasted good. In the sixties they would not let us out of the hospital with stitches. In a week the doctor took the stitches out and looked at my knee. He could not believe how good my knee looked and how nice it was. Praise the Lord! I was was playing hockey in nineteen sixty three my mom, dad, and sister and I were saved while watching a Billy Graham film. It is not easy to be a Christian on the colony. If it was not for a friend we can look to it would be very tough. Guess I could write some more but this will be all for now.

munity pasture. My sense of direction is usually pretty good, but that was not the case on this particular day. They have had a lot of rain, making it hard to get around in some fields. It has gotten really bushy and the ground so wet that every horse track you made quickly fills up with water. It's a bit of a challenge to find a dry spot to lay down a cow and keep your boots dry. Well on this day, I was trying to make my way around a big marsh, and got myself into some stuff that I couldn't get out of. It was cloudy, with no sun, thick willows laying all over, water up to my horses' knees and grass stirrup high. After a while of dragging through this stuff, heading north (I thought), I realized I really didn't know which way was north anymore (I was lost). So I had to swallow my cowboy-pride and called Dwayne on the radio, only to find out he was in the same situation. At that moment the sun broke through the clouds, and we both exclaimed that we now knew which way was south and could carry on heading in the right direction. But I still had the challenge of getting through all the thick willows and water. I was trying to make my way out by the way the grass made trails through the water. I would ask my horse to go the way I thought was best but sometimes he really didn't want to go. When we ended up in a place so thick, he could barely turn around, I thought maybe I should trust the instincts of my horse. So I would ask him to go, if he hesitated, I wouldn't go that way. Well I'm happy to say that my horse did get me out and in time for lunch! It's like that with the Holy

Spirit who is there to guide us, but we have to take the time to listen. Rom. 8:14, "For as many are led by the spirit of God, these are sons of God." Most of us do what I do, depending on our abilities or ask for help from another (who was just as lost as I was) instead of relying on God. I believe He caused the sun to shine, even if just for a brief moment and used my horse to get me out of the situation I found myself in. This is another parable (as I like to call it) that reminds us of the importance of listening to the Holy Spirit. When we are out of tune with the Holy Spirit and solely relying on our own abilities, that's quite often when we will find ourselves with no sense of direction (lost). Had I just listened to my horse instead of me, I wouldn't have been trudging through that marsh for so long.

We have had a good summer of ministry.....some good crowds at cowboy church, lots of fellowship and opportunities to pray for those in need. I have also spent time visiting with some folks, in the hospital or their homes, offering them the hope that only comes through Jesus Christ. There are so many people that need to have this hope....not only cowboys.

My how time has flown by since our last magazine!! Thank you to everyone for your continuing support by sending photos and articles for the magazine and webpage, in fact I have received so many that some will have to be used in the next issue!!! I am so pleased with this issue of the magazine. Praise The Lord!

What a difference a year makes in everyone's lives. In our last issue I wrote about the August 2014 hail storm which caused so much damage to our crops, yard and buildings. I spoke about my wish for one poppy seed and how the Lord responded by having poppies bloom by the hundreds in our yard. This summer we have been blessed with bumper hay crops, now all rolled up and in the stack yards. Our garden was tremendous providing us with fruit and vegetables which has been canned into one-hundred and seventeen jars of pickles, jams, and salsa. In July we had a problem with foot rot affecting both cows and calves, which we have not had for about ten years. But I hear many people even friends in Saskatchewan were dealing with the same issue. We used a vaccine that cost \$250.00 for a 250ml bottle, that sure backed it off quickly. Today we have treated two cows and six calves for pink eye. The calves are fat and happy and we hope the high prices will hold up until market time this fall.

Twice this summer when John FitzHerbert could not attend our Cowboy Church at the Sunrise Village in High River I had the honor of filling in for him with our friend Ed. I have never preached the gospel to one person let alone a crowd!! But John was confident I could do a good job. "Where He Leads Me I Will Follow" I was in Manitoba this July at a care facility for the elderly.
