

Accepting Jesus into my life as a young girl at the age of five years old; your first thoughts probably would be "you must of lived a life of sunshine and lollipops", or "you must lead a sin free life", or "perhaps you would think that was a very young age to fully experience a transformation as a born again believer." Answers would be No, No, Yes...

I was born in Kearney, NE three days before Christmas hence the name "Merry". I am the baby sister of my family of six. My mother was an amazing woman who loved the Lord with all of her heart! My Dad on the other hand "tolerated" Christianity in our home as he knew his wife was a prayer warrior and he was so blessed because of her prayers! He much later in life met Jesus on a personal level. I will say my Dad was such a hard worker and never gave up on anything he started. He certainly taught me how to have strong work



To this very day whenever my family gets together our conversation always leads to our days at Anahim Lake, which is so interesting because I do know we didn't have a lot financially. We lived in a log home with no running water, phone, or electricity (unless we ran the generator)! I remember we had a subscription to the "Western Horseman" and dreamed of owning a registered quarter horse one day!

It was a very hard life. The first few winters we lived there, my Mom taught in a one room school and got permission from the school board to teach Sunday School one day a week after school until we got a pastor (Milton Rutherford). He built the church for us to have services. Through his teaching we did learn about the trinity (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit). I understood God our father, Jesus his son, but we had never been taught about the comforter and the filling of the Holy Spirit. I was only twelve, but from that time forth being a

Christian gave me more meaning. And yes I was baptized in a horse tank in church!

There were even a few times in the summer we would ride our horses to church even though we lived about 10 km from town. For certain I know my Mom prayed everyday for her family. A mother's prayers are so powerful. A mother, in my opinion, has such a different relationship with her children, she is so in tune with her family. As a teenager and an adult sometimes praying was a thought far from my mind. It was her prayers that would always rope my independent spirit and spiritually tie me so I would listen or sit still long enough to hear his voice or nudging. Matthew 7:7 was my go to bible verse.

Being involved with horses is a huge part of my life and I will be the first to confess it's always been a real struggle to keep my priorities straight. To this very day it's a struggle! There have been times I've prayed to God to take away my love for horses, until one day the Lord impressed upon me to turn it all over to him in all areas. What a weight was lifted off of my heart and shoulders. Again I will admit its a struggle but a whole lot more fun. I completed my year to compete in the Miss Rodeo America Pageant in Oklahoma City as Miss Rodeo BC. And for the past couple of years I have been able

to chaperone at the M.R.A. Pageant. Yes God doesn't hover over us with a big stick and not let us enjoy doing things we love, but I do believe we as Christians should be the "salt and light" in the world.

Little did I know that the best was yet to come - I met and married my amazing husband, Robin Stoney. As I mentioned I know my Mom was praying for a wonderful husband for me and thank you Lord. I am old enough now to look back "far enough" in life to really see how Gods' divine meetings and protection have been thru every step of my life. Shortly after we were married we moved to Calgary where Rob would have a very successful career with the Calgary police Service. We are so thankful for this blessing! Seeing him and Grandpa enjoying each other I am reminded of Gods' grace and love that is for the asking and believing. Sierra is our youngest daughter, she and her husband own and operate Frontier West Shop in Claresholm. Not only do they live their dream of rodeoing successfully (7 CFR's between the two of them) but they get to work their dream. I love my family!

LIFE & TIMES OF THE HARGREAVES

Edmund Hargreaves, Ed or Eddie to most people, was born May 6, 1913. He was youngest of nine children, and grew up in the Neutral Hills area of Alberta. His parents had moved there from the Cypress Hills area with quite a herd of horses. Ed started riding as soon as he was big enough to get on a horse. He had to break his own saddle horses and as soon as he had one gentle, his Dad would sell it and he would have to break another!

Riding and roping were his everyday way of life. At an early age he was competing at the rodeos in the Saddle Bronc and Calf-Roping events. Ed and the Fisher boys would practice on any animal they could catch, quite often that being Mrs. Fisher's milk cow! They never had pick-up men when practising riding, so if they were not bucked off, they had to jump – hence they became pretty talented at jumping off!!

Ed went to all the rodeos he was able to get to, some of those being Big Valley, Black Hills, Hardisty, Lea Park, Czar, Gibbons, and Ponoka. During that period, he became acquainted with such names as Harold, Clarence, & Skinny Fisher, Mel Webb, Jimmy Baxter, Johnny Glazier, Bill Robinson, Dave Aberhamse, Finnis Bridge, Herbert Bourque, Ross Hinky, Frank Voros, Bill Brown, and Johnny Hawk as fellow-competitors, plus Bud Brooks and Jim Todd as the ever-so-capable pick-up men. Very few rodeos presented trophies to the winners in those days and the prize money would only amount to a few dollars. At that time money was of more use to the competitors than trophies.

It was at the Black Hills Rodeo that he met "Edith", born Dec. 30, 1915, the eighth of a family of fourteen children, and known to many as Ede. They were married May 6, 1936, in Provost. She travelled with Ed to most of the rodeos until he decided to quit in 1942 because they were milking so many cows and they had a young daughter to think of.

Ed and Ede moved to the Ford place between Czar and Metiskow in 1944 where they continued to make a living via farming, ranching, and milking cows. They always managed to find time to go as spectators to several rodeos. A second daughter was born in 1950 to fulfill their family. Eventually they quit milking the cows and both worked at the Provost Auction Market on Fridays to supplement their income.

The farm was sold in 1975 to Bev & Linda Berry from Provost who wanted it simply for pasturing cattle. They bought a house trailer and setup near the old house, and had an arrangement with Bev for Ed to keep his horse and cattle there in return for watching out for all the cattle in the summer, Bev at that time moved all the cattle to Provost for the winter.

In 1979, Ed and Ede decided to retire. They sold the cattle and horse, bought 1½ lots in Czar, and moved their trailer to town. They bought a motor-home and travelled extensively, doing a circuit of at least ten rodeos/bull-a-ramas each summer. Ed always said, "There's no such thing as a bad rodeo, just some are better than others"!

Ed had a heart attack and passed away November 30, 1990. Ede stayed living in the trailer in Czar and started driving the motor-home. Every summer she went to the same circuit of rodeos, taking one or two of her sisters and sometimes one or both of her daughters. She was very avid about her rodeos, getting all decked out in western attire, always notating all of the scores, and getting quite perturbed if someone interfered with her hearing of a name or a score! She never missed a Christian Cowboy Church Service if it was available at the rodeos she attended.

In 2012, at 97 years of age, she decided to move into an "independent" suite at the Points West Assisted Living Facility in Wainwright, AB for the winter. After two days in this environment. Ede further decided that this was a fantastic place for her so she put the wheels in motion to sell her trailer, her lot, and her motor-home. She gave away all her western boots, hats, and clothes because she was done with rodeos as well! At 98, she got the paper work for getting her driver's license for two more years, but chose to not even try for it, and to sell her car instead as she hadn't felt the need to drive anywhere after moving.

Ede had her 100th birthday on Dec. 30th, 2015, and is looking and doing very well for such an age. Ede still loves her independent suite at Points West, all the activities, residents, and staff there. She continues to knit and crochet lots (even teaching some of the staff how to do some projects), to sew and/or use her Serger whenever the need arises. Ede loves to play cards and is very sharp at all the games; especially "Bridge". She continues to manage all her own medications and finances. She can walk without a walker, but has resigned herself to using one for safety-sake. She loves to watch rodeos on TV, keeping close tabs on all of her favorite cowboys. Her only real problem is loss of hearing which does pose quite a problem for her on the phone or in large crowds, even with good hearing aids.

Ede and all her family feel tremendously blessed that she has been allowed to live this long with such a sharp mind and so very few things detrimental for her!
