



THE MIRACLES OF GOD

I was asked to give a testimony and I thought of a service Marlene had done at the jail in Medicine Hat. I took my bible and guitar in and sang some songs and then I told the prisoners about a miracle we had experienced. When I was done telling them about it I asked them if they wanted to hear a song or about another miracle they shouted "A Miracle".

I've seen so many miracles since I've been saved in 1986 I would need a whole book to write them all down. Here's a series that started a couple of years ago.

We had a little dog we called Muffy and I had a incredible heading horse I called Lace. I never thought I would get as close to animals as I did those two. We had a mobile concession booth and Muffy came with us where ever we went. We were at Cypress Hills park for a few days with the booth and staying in our motor-home. I took Muffy for a walk one evening, because she was losing her energy. All of a sudden she went down and stiffened up, her eyes were glazed and she couldn't breath. I knew she was having a heart attack, I was devastated. I fell on my knees and begged God to heal her. As I carried her back to the motor-home I pleaded with God, please don't let her die. Marlene and I laid hands on her and asked God to touch her. When we were finished she crawled into a corner and in a few minutes she came out completed healed.

We knew God had healed her heart because she was back to her old self, full of energy. We just praised the Lord. What a miracle! God heals people, but he will even heal a little dog when you ask!

Lace was never very gentle, kinda bronky and sometimes I would have to lunge her before I could get on. That spring I was roping a hard running steer at a roping, my foot came out of the stirrup and I landed on my head and my shoulder. I had a ultrasound on my shoulder and had torn my rotator cuff in two places. I would have to have a operation and would be laid up for eight weeks. One night I was watching and the preacher said he was going to pray for the people in TV land. He said to raise your hands to the Lord. I had to lift my right arm with my left. The hurt was unreal. Benny said "whoohoo!! Someone has a bad shoulder. Receive your healing in Jesus Name."

I said "that is for me." I felt a sensation in my shoulder and was completely healed. I went out and roped the dummy, pain free. I roped that fall and all winter in Arizona. No operation, not laid up, no hospital. It never cost anyone a dime! How about that?

The next summer Muffy got sick so I took her to the vet who said she had kidney failure. We begged God to heal her but a few weeks later we had to put her down. We found out that the dried dog food we had been feeding her was from China and had been cured with radiation! Several other little dogs had died from the same thing.

One month later Lace got in the barb-wire fence and cut herself up so badly it nearly severed her front foot and we had to put her down. We were completely heartbroken, we were sure that God had abandoned us, losing Lace and Muffy within a month. I was upset with the Lord

and didn't want to pray or go back to the jail. Lynette, our daughter had given us a dog (Dusty) about the same size as Muffy when we came home from Arizona. He seemed to realize how broken we were and just wiggled his way into our hearts and filled a hole that the loss of Muffy had left in us.


Then one day a neighbor told me a guy had a horse I might like, so I went and tried him. I turned him down twice and then the third time I tried him I bought him. I found out that a cowboy friend wanted him but wouldn't buy him until he was sure I didn't want him. The Lord knew he (Buddy) was the horse for me. He is 10 years old, been on a ranch and used as a hazing horse for a few years. He hadn't been roped on much but took right to it. Buddy is a paint (so is Dusty)! He is absolutely gentle, easy to get on, handles cattle good and in the end he will be a better horse than Lace. Maybe Lace was going to hurt me some where down the road and the Lord knew it and He was sparing me of that.

For anyone who reads this and you don't know the Lord just ask him into your life and see what happens. It will be the most wonderful thing that ever happens to you. I'm so glad I did!

To finish the story the dried dog food we fed Muffy it had written on the package to wash your hands and only feed one to two pieces a day and I had been feeding her all she wanted. That should have been my first clue that something was wrong with it. The truth is, I killed my own dog. I lost Lace because we had new neighbors with horses and a barbed wire fence between them. The Lord told me several times to tell them not to turn their horses out unless I was there. I didn't listen and as a result they fought over the fence and Lace got caught in the wire.

Nothing is too hard for the Lord. He replaced our dog and found me a nice rope horse. How blessed we are to know the God that created the earth and the heavens, the galaxies, the moon and put the stars into place. He set the world spinning and has perfectly timed all things - Matthew 21 & 22 - Jesus replied "I tell you the truth, if you have faith and do not doubt, not only can you do what was done to the fig tree, but also you can say to this mountain, go throw yourself into the sea and it will be done." If you believe, you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer.

REPORT

FROM JOHN FITZHERBERT

Hi Folks.

Seems like I always start with a weather report so I won't change this time. Spring came early in southern Alberta. Trees were putting out leaves in mid April and the grass came early. We had lots of warm dry days with heavy frosts at night and strong winds in the afternoons. It looked quite bad for moisture. Here in High River we have had about two inches of rain since the middle of the month of May so things look great. We are anxiously awaiting the flood season wondering how fast the snow will melt in the mountains. The town and province have spent millions building dykes around the town since the 2013 flood, but they are untested because the river stayed in its banks in 2014. We are praying and trusting the Lord that we don't have another disaster like 2013.

We have had two rodeo services as I write this, with many more done by the time you read this. Our first one was at Medicine Hat where we had a good crowd of people who come every year along with a few new ones. Dwain Wigemyr shared the Word on his favorite topic, which is end times. The next place we met was at Caroline, they have a big tent with some heaters blowing hot air into it. It had rained all the day before, the arena was a mud hole and it was chilly. Every other year when we have been there we would set up so the heat was coming in behind us, this year Marvin Engel said let the people have the heat and we will set up at the other end of the tend where it is cooler. It was so hot at our end I was cooked, but that is better that being cold. Marvin preached a good message. He told the people we have been doing Cowboy Church at this rodeo for about thirty years, some of you have heard the salvation message many times and you still have not responded positively to it. He said, "I don't know how many more times we will come because we are getting old, also Jesus is coming soon and you won't have another chance to get saved." Nobody told me they had made a commitment to the Lord but I am sure some did. Praise The Lord.



As the treasurer for both the Alberta Chapter and the Canadian Chapter I want to thank you for your giving this past six months. We put a notice in the magazine about going on the internet and we had to hear from you if you wanted to get the magazine in the old way due to the high cost of postage. I guess some of you thought we were broke and better send something. Well Praise The Lord you did. Thank you again. The truth is we are not broke in fact we are blessed with more money that we ever had thanks to you folks who keep on giving. By now, I would imagine most of the calves will be on the ground and the cattle folk well into getting the branding done. Without the overabundance of snow things dried up nicely, making it a lot easier on the calves. No sick calves this year!!!! PTL. With the drier ground, we were able to get the annual branding done a week earlier...a week or so can make a difference if you're mugging calves and most of your crew is eating off of the "senior's menu". Even though it was a lighter crew, it was a lot of fun for Dwayne and myself and less work for the folks on the ground. We used soft ropes and threw as many backhand and underhand shots as we could. Our goal was to drag every calf double hawked and necked to the branding iron, so no mugging would be needed. This did take a little more time, but it was a nice warm day and gave the chili time to get just a little bit Spicier!!! Now just waiting on the grass, before moving them out to the summer pastures, I sure enjoy looking at the cows on the pasture and riding out to check on them.

Matt 9:37 states "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few." It seems like we are all way too busy, even though our lives are filled with things that are supposed to make it easier and give us more time. But what do we do with that extra time....we just keep filling it up. That keeps us from getting together with friends and neighbors for things like brandings

or just a visit. How many of us haven't even taken the time to really get to know our neighbors? There are so many people out there that need to be encouraged in the Lord right now, not after you have checked yet another item off your list. The last time I visited with an almost 80 year old friend, he was wondering where his life had gone, it had passed by so fast. Now his health is starting to fail and he wishes he had done things differently. The Benefits of Giving

As I write to you today I am swinging under an old spruce tree enjoying its shade on this Sunday morning. An easy breeze is humming across the yard. Birds are singing an unknown melody and the flowers are waltzing back and forth in time with the breeze. Thank you Jesus.

John FitzHerbert talks about The Benefits of Giving earlier in the magazine. I would like to share a story about The Benefits of Receiving.

My husband and I take great pride in our yard, farm, crops and the cattle we raise. We are thankful for the health and knowledge to be able grow a garden, encourage life into a new apple tree seedling and watch the growing baby calves. I especially love the many flower beds that I have created in memory of special people in my life who have passed on.

August 4th 2014. In the morning dark clouds started building up high in the sky. They never seemed to be to particularly threatening, just, twisting, turning and building more around them. About 2:00pm in the afternoon I was in the house, my son and husband were down the road repairing a fence. They both come in and said "something is going to happen out there." Within fifteen minutes the sky turned black, a fierce cold wind let loose and the hail began. Little pea sized at first and then it stopped only to return back bigger and bigger, harder and harder, now with all sizes from pea to golf ball sized hail. I stood in our sun-room, hands covered over my ears and watched the trees being stripped of their leaves, gardens and flowers being flattened, hay fields leveled,

cows and calves racing across the coulee in search of shelter. We were now in the eye of the storm. I prayed it would stop. It did not. Fifteen minutes of pounding and crashing until it ended, followed by silence and sadness. I never questioned God why this happened, I know it just does. Later I walked among the beaten down piles of leaves, broken branches and other piles of debris. The next few weeks were very busy cleaning up what the hail had left behind. I asked God to please leave me one yellow poppy seed for next year in my Dads' flower bed as the poppy seeds were not ripe enough to reproduce next year.

Come the spring of 2015 we replaced the shingles on the house, watched the hay fields start to grow and the tiny buds appearing on the apple and poplar trees. Perennials came out of the ground as if nothing had happened the summer before. But no yellow poppies. About the end of April it rained a few inches followed by the sun. Still no yellow poppies. Another rain the beginning of May and my prayer and so much was answered. Yellow poppies are now blooming in every flower bed, in cracks in the sidewalk, in stones under spruce trees and under the cattle guard. Thank you Jesus.

My heart and faith has grown three times bigger and stronger. Ask and you will receive. Your faith will grow. When you receive, give thanks.
