TESTIMONY OF DALE CLEARWATER

My name is Dale Clearwater. My family and I currently own and operate Justabouta Ranch in central Saskatchewan. I was born and raised just outside of Nipawin Saskatchewan. My parents were grain farmers so my older brother and I got to run a lot of heavy equipment at a fairly young age. This made us feel pretty powerful. But, being a cowboy at heart, driving around and around, back and forth in the fields got very old and very boring pretty fast. It didn't take long and my interests started to take a turn to other things. Mom and Dad never tried to make me do something that wasn't of interest to me (granted I always had to carry my weight and do what I was told) so when my interests started shifting towards horses they were there for me and helped me to pursue my passion.

Some of those interests and past times were skateboarding, snowboarding, snowmobiling, and motorbikes. It was not until about the age of thirteen that I started to develop an interest in horses. My mom always liked horses and we usually had a couple kicking around. One day when the farrier came, he invited me to come and ride in the pasture he worked at. I was hooked on everything horse related after that!

I started out by getting a few horses of my own trained and sold them, this snowballed into starting horses for the public. I was homeschooled from Grade 8 through 12 so this gave me the opportunity to get a job working for the provincial community pastures when I was sixteen. I spent eight years riding different pastures across Saskatchewan. During these eight years I started competing in a few ranch horse competitions and the whole showing industry became quite intriguing. I attempted to get my foot in the door by working for some reining and cow horse trainers during the months I was not working on the pasture.

In 2002 I was blessed to marry my best friend and love of my life Teri. In the fall of 2003 we moved to our current location and stepped out on our own. Justabouta Ranch was established. We have since been blessed with two boys. Caleb was born in 2005 and Westin was born in 2009. It has been so much fun raising these two boys alongside Teri and building

our business, and ranching. As many of you know how the horse world works, it feels like our “family” has grown over the years with some great employees that to this day remain good friends, from customers who become as close as family and friends all across North America.

In the time we (and I say we because just because I am the one in the show pen, it would not happen without all the effort Teri puts in outside the show pen) have been involved in the horse industry I have had the privilege of competing in the Reined Cow Horse, Cutting, Reining, and Barrel Racing arenas as well as Ranch Horse competitions and Colt Starting competitions, not to leave out my short time as a amateur saddle bronc rider, calf roper and ranch roper. I have been blessed to win a lot of buckles, saddles, and money along the way, but when the dust settles, none of it matters in the end. I think you know what I mean by end.

In working with a lot of animals over the years I have never found an animal that thinks about the end the way us humans do. We are the only species that knows there will be an end. God has given us each a conscience. The word “Conscience” means With Knowledge. So therefore, we know (different than the animals) that there will be an end.

Let me skip back to the beginning again to fill in the gap I purposefully left out until now. That gap being the Christian part. Christianity for me was just another part of growing up. My parents were Christians, we were involved in a local church, and I had Christian friends. I actually don't think my family ever missed church (twice on Sunday), bible study, or youth group events. I even played the drums for a while in church. I really never knew there was another life other than Church.

Growing up there were plenty of times that I didn't have to be talked into doing many things that were sinful. There was always my conscience that would tell me it was wrong, or one of my parent's hands across my backside also brought it to my attention. Even so, growing up in a Christian home and going to church I believed I was "good enough" to receive my eternal reward because the good that I did would outweigh the bad. As I grow in knowledge though, I started to understand that it wasn't "good works" or that I had a pew in church with my butt imprint on it that was going to get me to Heaven.

Paul says in Ephesians 2:8,9 "for it is by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from yourselves; it is God's gift- not from works, so that no one can boast."

So, in other words it didn't matter what good things I had done growing up as a "Christian", that wasn't going to get me home. I knew I was a sinner from reading Romans 3:23 "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" and also my conscience was working overtime the older I got and the more I became aware of my sin. Sometimes I think we can let sin sear our conscience. Those who delight in sin, because they have dulled their conscience are like a man who removes the batteries from his smoke detector because he doesn't want to be bothered by its noise. That was me, I thought all the good Christian stuff in my life would outweigh the bad (the sin).

It wasn't until later in life that Ephesians 2:8 finally started to make sense. My faith is a gift. It is nothing I earned. But the truth of the matter is that everyone is still going to have to face God as our judge. Romans 14:12 "So then each of us will give an account of himself to God" and Hebrews 9:27 "just as it is appointed for people to die once and after this, judgement" Now the question is did I have faith in Jesus or

did I try to get to the end by being "good"?

In closing let me share a story I heard. I will paraphrase and change names (will call them Dale and Brian), but you will get the point.

Two gentlemen were visiting and got talking about Christianity. Dale says to Brian "I hope all the good I have done will outweigh the bad when I get up there". To which Brian replies "You know it does not work like that. One day you, me, and everyone will have to stand before God and God will do what any good judge would do. Let me ask you this. Who is the person closest to you in this world?" "Probably my wife" Dale says "Suppose she is brutally beaten and murdered and the guy that did the crime was caught and put on trial. The criminal says to the judge that he knows he committed this offence but that he has also done a lot of good in his life and lists a whole bunch of things off." Brian continues "if the judge lets him go free would you say he is a good judge or a bad judge?" "A bad judge" Dale responds. "That's right" Brian says. "The Bible tells us that God is a good judge and he will punish the guilty not for what they did right but for what they did wrong, but because He loved us so much he sent his son Jesus Christ to take the punishment we deserve and Jesus put it on himself. That's why he died on the cross. But this amazing gift of grace only applies if you accept it."

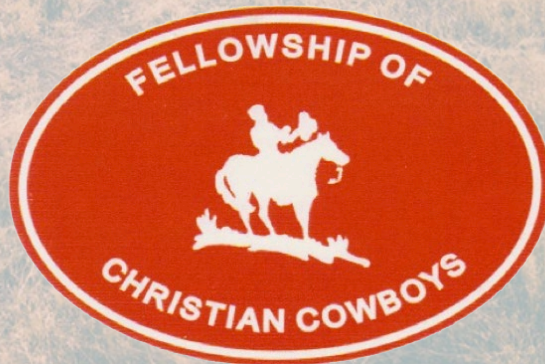
She is survived by her loving husband Terry, two sisters Grace, Fay and numerous other relatives and friends.

The Benefits of Giving

This time I will write about some of the promises that God has given. We will start with Gen. 12:1-3. Now the Lord said to Abram, "Get out of your country, from your

family and from your father's house, to a land that I will show you. I will make you a great nation; I will bless those who bless you, and I will curse those who curse you; and in you all families of the earth shall be blessed. Wow what a promise! It started with Abram and will last until Jesus comes in the clouds to take us home to Heaven.

Gal. Chapter 3 tells us that we have the blessings of Abraham, when we receive Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. Jacob who was the grandson of Abraham he had his name changed by God to Israel. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As I sit and write this, I can feel the warmth of the sunshine. Finally, a nice warm day. Would be perfect for calving, but most of my calves are already on the ground. February calving is usually cold, and this year was no exception with below normal temps. Despite the very cold weather, calving went well... no frozen ears PTL. Next on the agenda will be the branding, trusting the corral will be dried up and we can get it done before May. The longer we leave it, the bigger they get, and it just gets too hard for the aging ground crew!! On a positive note, all this snow and moisture should help green up the pastures.

At our January AGM, we tossed around some ideas on how this ministry could be more effective, as there seems to be less and less folks coming out to Sunday morning Cowboy Church. In fact, some rodeos will have other things going on that participants are required to go to. Makes me kinda wonder where we fit into all of this and perhaps we need to approach things from a different angle. We are considering hosting a Saturday night banquet with a guest speaker, and maybe sponsoring some clinics. Our chapter has been sponsoring an outreach horse program for a few years and sent a young Christian fella (Colton Abrahamson) to a bull riding school earlier this year. We look forward to hearing his testimony and hope to convince him to share it with you all. Also, keep your eyes on the magazine and website, for updates, pictures and etc. of the things going on with the chapter.

Last fall, one of my horses, "Big D", as we call him, had something going on with him. I glanced over at him and it appeared that one of his back legs was sore and swollen. My first assumption was he must have slipped and strained it, but a few days later both back legs were swollen making it very hard for him to get around. The vet was going to be out in a few days to do some preg. testing, so I thought he could have a look at "Big D" then, but the vet thought it would be better to bring him in, if I could get him loaded on the trailer. That big boy has so much heart, he walked right into the trailer despite the pain he must have been in. The vet checked him over and "Big D" seemed to be OK, so he wanted to do some blood tests thinking it might be lime disease. When the tests all came back normal, I said to the vet that I would give him some dexamethasone (anti-inflammatory steroid) and see what happens. The vet agreed, stating that's probably all we could do. So, I gave "Big D" a shot and the swelling went down, but only for a week or so. The vet said to give him another shot, but once again the swelling came back. This pattern went on for a while and I said to the vet we are only treating the symptoms not the cause.

In life, I find that we are like that, only treating and dealing with the symptoms without really getting to the bottom of the cause. And really, why waste your time, when these symptoms never go away? We will try all kinds of things to make ourselves feel better, but it usually only works for a while. Disagreement is an area that can cause a lot of conflict, because our pride gets in the way.

You hear people complaining about others because they don't agree with them and it becomes easier to just avoid them, instead of having a conversation to try to work out their differences. And as a result, the conflict is never resolved. Matt: 18:15, tells us that we need to get together and work things out and Matt:5:22-25 states that we should leave our gift (offering) at the altar and go work out our issues, then return to the altar.

It is very hard to move forward in the Lord, when we spend all our time trying to deal with the symptoms instead of just focusing on the cause of our troubles. We really don't need to carry all that extra baggage!! More often than not, we struggle through the symptoms of fear because of the circumstances we are in. News from a Doctor appointment or perhaps a family crisis are situations that come to mind. The cause of fear is lack of peace. We have no peace because we put our trust in the things of this world instead of the one who is the only giver of peace, "Jesus Christ".

We can be overcomers of this fear, when we have made Jesus Christ our Lord and savior!! "For everyone who calls on the Lord will be saved", Rom.10:3. We need to boldly proclaim and profess that Jesus is Lord. "That if you confess with your mouth Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved, for It is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you confess and are saved", Romans 10:9.10. We need to set our minds on the things above and not the things of this world as stated in Colossians 3:2.

I am overjoyed to say that Big D is back to normal; we got the bottom of his problem; dealt with and treated the cause (an infection) and the symptoms have all disappeared. Praise the Lord!

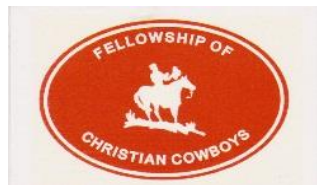
