

I currently work as a horse trainer at Anchor J Ranch in Camrose, part-time as a Youth Pastor at our local church, a Professional Rodeo Cowboy, farrier, and have a teaching degree. Together with my wife Renee, we have a son Coy (age 3) and a daughter Emmie (age 1). Life is busy but we love it. We are incredibly blessed by our loving Savior and strive to live our lives for His Kingdom purposes. The struggle to feel entitled is real and it is a constant battle to obey God rather than seek what is self-fulfilling. We are far from perfect.

We certainly live in a world that is changing rapidly. I was once a kid that drank from a garden hose, slept in a crib with lead-based paint, and rode a bike (and everything else for that matter) without a helmet. Today, I look around at a troubled generation, seeking fulfilment in virtual reality, social media, and consumerism. I am not saying the sky is falling by any means. One could argue that an addiction to technology is less harmful that chewing on lead-based paint but we shall leave that to the scientists and researchers. Every generation faces different and evolving problems. For our purposes, we will label these problems "temptations."

Perhaps one of the biggest temptations in our world today is the allure of success and the misinterpretation of what it means in a Biblical context.

The idea of success is something that has confused me in the past and certainly has wreaked havoc on many who deem themselves as failures. A right perspective on success can truly help an individual live a more peaceful, hopeful and purposeful life. Many struggle with entitlement; the feeling that we think we deserve this or that. Biblically, we know what we deserve. Romans 6:23 says, "For the wages of sin is death..." Therefore, we all have sinned and the one thing that is common to all humanity is that we deserve death. That's all we truly deserve. Theologically then, whenever we think we deserve anything in life, whether we have worked for it or not, we are not obeying God. Everything good thing that we have in life is because God has allowed it to be so. Our response to blessing ought to be pure thankfulness with an accompanying degree of responsibility to love God and love neighbor. Even where we live and the opportunities that we have are because of God's sovereign choice for us to be born in North America. We live in a place where we are taken care of for the most part. Our needs are met. "We have all won the birthplace

correctly into a healthy Biblical worldview? The truth of our human existence is that if we have truly acknowledged our need for Christ and have put all of our faith and trust in Him to reconcile us back to God and overcome our sin problem, we have absolutely nothing else to worry about. Making yourself into a "somebody" is an idea that our society pushes heavily. Therefore, success gets measured by economic status, athletic abilities, your IQ, your accomplishments etc. I think that a healthy understanding of knowing what it means to be successful is fully understanding your true identity as a child of God. ALL of our identity ought to be formed in Christ. Therefore our only true purpose in life is achieved by obeying God. We are made right with God through the sacrifice of Jesus and the only things we can do of any eternal value here on earth are those things that are done in obedience to Christ. Most importantly, loving God and loving neighbor are our biggest mandates. I think we all struggle enough with these two concepts that we need not go off on too many other theological rabbit trails. Therefore, whether we are rich or poor, smart or not so smart, accomplished or a nobody, we are all somebody to God. We are all loved unconditionally by God no matter what we have done or do on a daily basis. There is nothing we can ever do to make God love us more and there is nothing we can ever do to make God love us less. God's love is unconditional. God has a purpose for each and every one of us in His Kingdom that is present both now and in the future. Death has been defeated! The crux of the matter, then, is what we make of Jesus Christ in our

Since our identity, purpose, and value are rooted in Christ, we have little to worry about in terms of success. I used to think that success defined who I am. I am excited to learn that God defines who I am and it is my privilege to get to "...take up my cross daily and follow Him" (Luke 9:23). By becoming less, Christ can become more through me. It is not about what I can make of myself in the rodeo arena or anywhere else in life but rather what I make of Christ in my life for my own salvation and for others to see that counts. I think that I have allowed my rodeo successes to define me in the past. That was a big mistake and led to a construed worldview. I now measure success in my own life based upon the Bible's truths. These include: how well am I

obeying Jesus on a daily basis? How much effort am I putting into my relationship with God? How prevalent are the fruits of the Spirit in my life? How am I treating others? Treating family? These are the things/actions here on earth that are everlasting. Our bank accounts, trophies, titles, accomplishments, and buckles become absolutely nothing when we die. They are of no eternal value. This truth is something that gives me hope. When I compete, I am no longer concerned with accomplishments. Do not get me wrong, I am perhaps the most competitive person I have ever met. There are few that compete harder at anything. But, my motive for training and competing hard is to use my God-given abilities and to generate income to support my family. I am more concerned now with how I compete and am focused more on balancing my time between work, ministry, and family in attempts to be a disciple of Christ and a Godly leader for my family.

The Lord has been so good to our family. Justin and I are currently 2nd in the Canadian standings and we look forward to some time off in the next stretch of rodeos as we take some vacation time and I will be taking our church youth group to Ensenada, Mexico to serve in an orphanage. We look forward to hosting the Fellowship of Christian Cowboys team roping jackpot on August 30 and a free school on August 31. It is a great way to spread the Good News to the rodeo world.

God is good all the time, no matter the circumstances. As Christians, we are called to be a joyful people. Joy is not dependant on circumstance. Joy is something we are called to be and is wholly dependant on our faith. If we are assured of our salvation how can we worry and how can we not be joyful? I urge you to examine how successful you are Biblically and look to rid yourselves of entitlement and measuring success by how the world defines it. Climbing the worldly ladder of success always results in emptiness and the need for more. We can never achieve enough. On the contrary, in Christ, we have everything we need!

John 16:33 Jesus said, "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

Through out my life this is the kind of weather we expect, we can get a lot of work done with no snow and no frost in the ground. Climate change people are making lots of noise that it is getting warmer, but I don't see much change and they don't have the numbers to prove it.

Terrorists are bringing fear to people in different countries and I wonder how many we will be bringing into Canada disguised as refugees. Turkey and Russia are making threats against each other, Arabs are fighting Arabs. Muslims are fighting Muslims. Wars and rumors of wars are what we see on the news casts today. any decisions were made. Changes did not come quickly, 1935 saw some rain but in 1936 the mountains were on fire from the deep south to long way north, smoke and ashes covered the land. Also in 1936 oil was discovered at Turner Valley, people came from all across Canada to work in the oilfields. The rains came and Alberta blossomed to become the richest province in Canada. William Aberhart gave way to Ernest Manning, another Bible man who continued this legacy till he retired, non Christians took over the leadership and this Government was defeated by the Conservatives. The Manning Government left Alberta with no debt and money in the bank. We only have to look at the Old Testament to see how God prospered the land when they had a Godly King and how he took his hand from them when their leaders worshiped other gods. Alberta is now billions in debt just like other provinces and Canada itself. Pray for our leaders who as far as I know are not God fearing people. He can still do a miracle.

We had a busy summer again, going to rodeos and other places. There seems to be lots of opportunities to present the Gospel but there is getting to be fewer of us to go and do it. I think taking this magazine out of the mail and putting it online has caused a lot of people to forget about this fellowship. The Benefits of Giving

Every time I give a Cowboy Bible to someone I write a scripture reference under the cover. The Scripture is 2 Tim 1:7 "For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind." I have used this verse many times over the years in various situations, some involving me and some other peoples problems. While we are waiting on God to answer our prayers doubts can start to come in, we start to lose faith and the next thing that comes is fear. What if God doesn't answer this one? We have to go to that and other scriptures to find the fear we have does not come from God. Fear is an enemy to faith, and we either operate in one or the other.

One time I was hauling grain with a big truck. I had to go down a long hill with a bridge at the bottom. I felt I was going to fast at the top of the hill so I geared down one gear, nothing happened to slow me down so I tried the brakes and I had none, something caught my eye in the mirror, it was smoke, the bearing had gone and my hind wheels came out and rubbed on the box. I could see them out about a foot from where they should be. When will they come off, what will happen when they come off, these thoughts raced through my mind. I was almost blind with fear. I called out the only thing in my mind and that was JESUS. As fast as the fear came it was gone, I could see, I could think, I steered the runaway truck all the way down the hill until just before the bridge, the wheels left me and I crashed to the pavement, it cut a ditch in the road but I was parked on the wrong side of the road. Praise the Lord. The wheels went for a quarter of a mile before they stopped. They had a lot of speed!!!!

Last year I met a couple who came here from Africa, they are of Dutch or English descent. They were forced off

their land by the blacks, not legally but pushed off with nothing, no cattle, food, or clothes, just get out or you will be beaten or killed. They managed to get out to High River where they have a daughter and family. They have applied to the Canadian Government for papers that would allow them to stay in Canada, but to no avail. If they are forced to go back to Africa they will be persecuted severely or even killed. Every application they make to Canadian authorities comes back with a no. He could not work legally for a while but was finally given a work permit. Their faith that God can take care of this is getting really weak. Last week they were told they will be deported, this hit them so hard that fear has just about paralyzed them. I still believe that God can turn this around,

The Bible is full of stories that can build up our faith, with the one that come to my mind right now is in 1 Kings:17. Elijah has told the king that there will be a very severe drought, it would not rain till he said so. The Lord told him to hide from the king because he would be killed. So he went where the lord directed and ravens brought him food and he drank from the brook till it dried up. The Lord told him to go and live with a widow, but when he got there she was making the last meal for her and her son, then they would die because they had no food. Elijah told her to feed him first and not fear the Lord would provide for them till the rains came. They both had a problem but God brought them together and solved it all.

This time I wrote about what God has not given next time what he has given.
