Gratitude

I was very blessed to be born in a loving Christian home and family on a farm in Central Alberta. My dad was a Polish immigrant and my mom was a first-generation Canadian. They had worked extremely hard to make ends meet for my two older sisters and me. Farming and working in construction was a tough way to make a living but my dad did that and my mom was right beside him nearly every step of the way.

When I was 15 the long days and hard work took its toll on my dad and he ended up in the hospital with a heart

attack. This left me with the chores to do before and after school. There were a couple of cows to milk by hand, pigs to feed, calves to look after, and other chores as well.

My daily routine consisted of Chores in the morning then rushing to the bus and off to school. Home from school, evening chores, homework, and then bed. Next day repeat and so on. I can't really remember how long this went on but I can tell you this: I was very close to my dad. He was my hero! He was my confidant! He was my best friend! He was the one I would run to when I got bullied at school. His embrace was what kept this teenager going.

My mom and dad showed us what it was to have a relationship with God and to spend time in prayer on a regular basis. To recognize that God was our source and strength and that we could come to Him with whatever needs we had in our lives. So, every day when I was out doing the chores, I would pray and cry and cry and pray and call out to God to please heal my daddy. "God please don't let my daddy die, please God I'm 15, I need my dad. Please God please."

Eventually, my daddy came home and after a period of time, he slowly began to help with chores and get strong enough to do even more of what he loved doing around the farm and even got back to some construction but had to know his limits. A few years later it was obvious that he would not be able to return to all that he had done before and so we sold the farm and moved into a small city. That is where I completed high school.

The next fall I was led to go to Bible College. From the age of about 12, I knew that there was a call in my life for ministry and so I knew I had to follow that call. I am grateful for those 3 years of college, as I not only was grounded and rooted even deeper in my relationship with the Lord but God also blessed me with a precious young lady who has been my wife for nearly 40 years.

Following graduation from Bible College, I began ministry in a church in Calgary as a youth Pastor. This was a whole new experience for me as I was still very much a farm boy. So, finding my way around a big city certainly had its challenges. I am so thankful for Senior Pastors and youth leaders in the church who took me under their wing and showed me the ropes and mentored me along the way. While in Calgary I had the opportunity to be involved in not only the church but also in Prison Ministry and Street Ministry.

Since then I have been in several different communities and had the privilege of working with a multitude of incredible people. I am so grateful for each and every person that God has brought into my path and for each and every opportunity. Oh, and by the way, God answered that 15-year-old boy's prayer because He saw fit to give me my Dad for another 39 years. My daddy went home to be with Jesus 7 years ago at the age of 95.

I am truly grateful for parents who not only taught us about honor and respect but actually modeled it for us to see. We were taught and shown from a very young age how to honor and respect all those who were around us regardless of who they were. Honor and respect were to be given to old and young, rich and poor, and people were not to be judged because of the color of their skin or their heritage. This was something we were not just taught but we got.

This was an incredibly valuable lesson as I have gone through my life. I have been able to build many meaningful relationships as a result of these early examples.

In one South Eastern Alberta Town that I had the privilege of pasturing in, the local radio station used to have a program called "The Trading Post" or something like that. It was a slot of time given each day for people who had an item to sell wanted to buy or people needing help. On one particular day, I was just leaving town and was listening to this program. A young lady called in and shared how she needed some help fixing her fence around her yard in town so that her dog would stop getting out. As she was sharing her need, the Holy Spirit began to speak to my heart that this was something that I should do. I quickly took down her phone number and stopped at one of the stores before I left town (This was obviously before cell phones). I called her and she was quite surprised at the quick response. I told her I was heading out of town but would contact her as soon as I got back. She was very grateful.

When I returned I went and looked at the work that needed to be done and did it for her. As I sat in my office later that day, again the Holy Spirit spoke to my heart and showed me that there were many others in the community who needed help but were perhaps too afraid to ask. I met with one of my board members that day and decided that this would be a phenomenal opportunity for outreach and an avenue to bless our community. So, we started a handyman service for single moms, senior citizens, and people with disabilities.

I was able to share the idea with the town's Mayor, who in the middle of me explaining, excused himself and went and got the director of Family and Community Support Services. He said, "you have to hear this." They both listened intently and were so supportive.

I then met with the local newspaper and told them that we just wanted to be a blessing to our community and that this was not just for our congregation but for the whole community. Their only concern was: "What if people take advantage of you?" I assured them that we were not concerned about that as we were doing this as unto the Lord and if they did take advantage of us they would have to answer to Him. The story went out in the newspaper and before long people were calling us to do small fixes, mow grass, shovel snow, and a variety of other small jobs.

We didn't charge anything for our services but some people would make donations which we would in turn use to help other people out who didn't have the means to do the things that needed to be done. The men and women of the congregation were loving the opportunity to serve and love their neighbors.

One day I will never forget was when I received a call from a senior lady who was moving from an apartment to another residence. She called to ask if we could come and help her move as she had no one in the area to help her. We said absolutely and myself and another gentleman went over. After loading the first load in the back of his truck and putting lamps etc. in the front, the lady jumped in the truck with my friend and I followed them to her new place. We got to the new place unloaded the furniture etc. and headed back for the last load. As we finished loading and were saying goodbye to the lady, I said: "Ma'am if there is anything else you need, be sure and call us." She looked at me with tears in her eyes and said "Ben, what I really need is Jesus." Where did that even come from? I was shocked but didn't realize that on the way over to her new place with the first load of furniture she had been asking my friend questions about God. So, in that empty apartment, we had the opportunity to lead this precious senior lady in the sinner's prayer and introduce her to Jesus. To be real honest, that sweet lady wasn't the only one with tears running down her cheeks that day.

The moral of my story is this: God is desiring to use us in creative ways to reach those who are around us. He wants to love them through us. We thought we were going to move this lady from one residence to another and instead, we were able to assist her in changing her eternal destination.

Please never underestimate the power of an encouraging word or a selfless deed. Those are the things that God uses to impact other people's lives.

Jesus said in Matthew 25:40; I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.

For some time, I have been looking for a young ranch horse, and this has not been an easy task. Seems impossible to find a good horse that a cowboy can afford to take to work. Last year, one of my good horses got hurt and as of now, I don't know if he'll be sound enough to use in a couple of months. I do know that I don't want to pay a lot of money for a horse and have him get hurt. I always look to see how sound a horse is, are his feet straight, is he big boned and will he be around for me to enjoy and use for many years?

This got me thinking about how we live our lives. Really, we should be living them in the same way we use when we want to buy a horse and always looking towards the future. Most folks just live for the here and now, and often our health reflects that. We try to feed our horses the best, while we live on junk food and have so many bad habits that are hard on us. Would you buy a horse with bad lungs, who was coughing and puffing all the time? I don't think so, yet many of us do this to ourselves. We need to live our lives for the future and encourage others to do the same.

We know that Christ holds our future and will return for those who call Him Lord and Saviour. Most cowboys will ride and look after their horses for tomorrow. They spend the time needed to invest into the future of their horse. Whether you use them in competition, doing ranch work or just for pleasure riding, you want your horse to be the best it can be. What are we doing to invest into people's lives? Are we getting them prepared for the future? With everything that's going on in this world, people need to hear hope, and who better to do this than us, the followers of Christ?

The truckers brought some hope to this country, as they stood up for our freedoms. Now it's time for the church to bring hope. That didn't last long, after only having him for a week he got hurt (most likely a lifechanging injury). Sometimes our future plans don't end up the way we think they should, but that doesn't mean we should relent back to only living in the moment. The better plan is to keep moving forward trusting that the Lord has a grand future in store for us all.

I have witnessed this on several occasions, but only have time to share one. As cowboys, we always seem to be looking for that certain one horse and several years ago, I got one. A good friend of mine kept telling me that he had a horse that I needed to have. I really wasn't interested; this horse was only ridden for three weeks as a three-year-old and then was kicked out to the pasture until I threw a saddle on him as a seven- year-old. His feet had never been picked up or trimmed but they actually didn't look too bad. In my mind he was just a bay horse that wasn't even broke so why would I want him? After three or more years of this friend constantly telling me that I needed to own this horse, I finally went and had a look and am thankful that I did. That horse moved so free that I knew I had to have him. I cowboyed, team roped and did ranch horse competitions off the back of this horse. He was very athletic and one of the best horses I ever owned. He had so much heart. My daughter even barrel raced him. Then it happened one day, he got old. But he still has a purpose, the grandkids get to ride him and he babysits them. There are days when he walks a bit sore, but then, so do I.

My good friend knew that I needed this horse and was very persistent until it happened. Just think of the lost souls we could lead to Jesus if we were this persistent in our Christian walk! All it took was a moment spent with that horse and I knew I needed him, just as it is with Jesus, once you have had an encounter with Him, there's no turning back. We all know people who need the Lord but are we helping to prepare them for their tomorrows, by sharing Christ, just as cowboys will do whatever it takes to make their horse better than they were the day before? "For I know the plans I have for you declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future", Jer.29:11.

We are looking forward to some ministry opportunities this summer and it would be awesome to fellowship with you all again.

The Benefits of Giving THANK HE HAS

I can't remember when I started writing the "Benefits of Giving", but it is quite a few years ago. I started writing about how we are blessed when we give to the Lord our time, money, praise, and prayers. I soon found out that we don't give the Lord very much compared to what he gives us. He just wants all of us, all the time.

There is an ancient custom that the Lord did with Abraham in Genesis 15, called the way of the blood. In verse 9 He said to him bring me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old female goat and a three-year-old ram, a turtle dove, and a young pigeon. Abraham brought all these to Him and cut them in two and laid each half opposite the other, but the birds he did not cut. The two parties who were making the covenant would walk between the halves, when they got to the end one would turn left and the other would turn right and come together where they had started,

The pagan people would cut their wrists then tie them together so that the blood mixed before it touched the ground. The Godly people did not cut themselves. After this, they would have a meal together of bread and wine. They would sometimes plant a tree or make a heap of stones. In this story, God went through between the pieces but Abraham did not. Verse 17 and it came about when the sun had set; that it was very dark and behold there appeared a smoking oven and a flaming torch which passed between the pieces.

On that day the Lord made a covenant with Abraham. The Lord went between the two pieces in the form of fire. This was a Covenant that promised to bless Abraham and all his descendants and all nations Genesis 12: 3 and in you, all the families of the earth shall be blessed. When we look at Galatians 3:14 so that in Christ Jesus the blessings of Abraham might come to the Gentiles so that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith. We can see we must have Jesus as our Lord and Saviour for the blessing to come upon us.

THANK GOD FOR THE GIFT OF POWER HE HAS GIVEN US.

We will now look at the roles governing this covenant. <u>They exchanged robes</u> meaning I am giving you all of myself, my total being. A mutual exchange of Authority.

1. In return, God has given us a robe of righteousness. That means we have a right to stand with God.

<u>They exchanged weapons</u> that were carried on a belt meaning I will protect you.

1. My strength is your strength I will fight for you and with you. Zechariah 4:6 Not by might not by power but by my Spirit says the Lord, also 2 Corinthians 10:4 For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds. Wow, when God is fighting our battles, we cannot lose.

<u>Cut the covenant</u> (cutting the flesh of sacrificed animals, walk of the blood) means we are dying to ourselves and giving up the right to our own life, and beginning a new walk with my covenant partner to death. Each is willing to die to protect the other.

- 1. Jesus Christ has already done this for us.
- Swearing Allegiance Symbolizes loyalty to each other and shaking hands means we are both sworn to this agreement and God is our witness.

Exchange names I take your last name as part of my name and you do the same.

- 1. A change of name symbolized a covenant relationship, which means like a marriage. We are called Christians.
- 2. <u>Make a Scar</u> Shed some blood that leaves a scar means we are heirs of God joint heirs in Christ. Jesus bears the scars of crucifixion for us.

<u>Give covenant terms</u> Listing assets and liabilities, all possessions, family, and property means everything I have is yours, and everything you have is mine.


- 1. He owns the cattle on a thousand hills, the wealth in every mine.
- 2. <u>Eat a Memorial Meal</u> Bread and wine, communion. This is the new testament of my Blood this is my Body that was broken for you. Healing.
- 3. <u>Plant a Memorial</u> Tree or a pile of stones as a place of remembrance for what we have done, we are known as a friend now. Children are included even unborn ones. Later when they are born and come to an age of understanding about covenant, they can choose to stay in or reject it.

As I wrote at the start of this, we don't give very much when we enter into this covenant. Our Lord gives us so much.

Thank God for giving us all these blessings.


