If God is so loving, Why Would He let this happen?

I want to start by saying what a great honor it is for me to be part of the Fellowship of Christian Cowboys and to have this opportunity to testify about the incredible grace of our Lord Jesus Christ! Thank you to everyone involved in this important work of "Carrying the Message of Christ to the Cowboy World." May the Lord continue to bless this wonderful mission.

So again, what an honor to share with you. I am humbled to be given this opportunity because I don't have a great rodeo background or big ranch or even a big farming background, just a simple guy who owns a few horses, wears a cowboy hat, and loves the Lord. So, thank you for taking the time to read about how God has been so faithful and good to me.



I praise God that I was born into a Christian home and heard the word of God spoken every day, which would prove to be very important in my later years. At a very impressionable age, my oldest brother, with whom I was very close, was killed in a car accident, and my world was suddenly turned upside down. I began to drift rather quickly away

from the things of the Lord and the things that my family held so dear.

Looking back, I can now see that it is a trap that Satan uses to enslave people. The question is always this: *"If God is so loving, why would He let this happen?"* I fell headlong into that trap and began to run from God as far as I could possibly get, becoming like a modern-day Jonah.

Deep in my heart, I still knew that God was good and that His way was right, but there was a very real battle raging, and the lies of the enemy were leading me further and further away. My life would soon become saturated with drugs and alcohol, even from a young age. Which inevitably would lead to tragic events that still grieve me to this day.

By the time I reached the age of eighteen, I was on a path of self-destruction, though I was too blind to see it. There would be many run-ins with the law and with the courts.

Many relationships ended in despair and frustration. I became somewhat of a drifter, running from trouble, only to create more, which would always result in having to run again. During this time, I met a beautiful Christian girl who took a chance on me, and we dated for several months, but once again, I was only interested in what was in it for me, and without a thought for her, I ended that relationship and headed off after more trouble.

Proverbs 16:9 *"A man's heart plans his way, but the Lord directs His steps."* That is such a true and powerful verse. The farther I ran from the Lord, thinking I was going in a completely different direction, the more I began to see that the Lord was bringing me right back where I started. After five years apart, the beautiful Christian girl, who never gave up on me, was once more introduced into my life.

It was 1994, I was leaving to move out to Alberta and see what trouble I could cause out there, when a friend made sure that we connected once more before I left. I saw in her exactly what I needed: someone to care for, someone to be responsible for, and someone who loved God. However, that trap is powerful, and it had me tightly caught. I left once again and headed west, but something was happening deep down. I was starting to hate everything about my life, the drinking, the drugs, the constant running, all the consequences of horrible choices. Meanwhile, throughout this entire time, my father was fasting constantly and praying without ceasing for his very prodigal son. I began wanting something more, something greater, something eternal.

Eventually, that young Christian girl would join me out west, we would get married, and we would have a son. That is when God began to shake me. I wanted to raise my son in the things of the Lord, but I was still living for the world, so a choice had to be made.

Joshua once commanded the Israelites, "Choose for yourself this day whom you will serve, and if it be the Lord, then serve Him in faithfulness and truth." Those words hit me hard. Who do I serve, the God of my own making, or the God of heaven and earth?



We lived in a remote place, and I spent several days sitting up on a hill all alone, looking down at our little house, my wife, and my son.

It was there that I wrestled with the Lord: Who would I serve? I thank the Lord that He never once gave up on me. Though I dragged His name through the mud and did

my best to run from Him, He continued to pursue me and to show me eternal things. There on that hill, I gave my life over to the Lord, confessing to Him all that I had done, but believing that He could redeem it.

From that moment on, I committed to serving the Lord. It's funny, out there on that hill, I didn't hear trumpets playing or fireworks going off, just a quiet peace that God had heard my cry and that He would save my



soul. After that, life didn't go perfectly, and things weren't always easy, as the battle of the flesh is very real. But God is faithful, and He began to show me a way of escape from the wiles of the enemy.

Several years later I would enroll in biblical studies, get baptized in the Jordan river, be blessed with two more children, and that beautiful Christian girl that I married, she and I, through the grace of the Lord, would embark on a journey of pastoral ministry for the Lord that has been so rich and so incredibly rewarding.

But all the praise and all the glory go to the One who is faithful and True. To the One who has saved my soul, and who will save your soul as well.

1 John 1:9, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Presidents' Report

There is just so much going on in this country that's just not right, well, really, it's all over the world. I would hope that most folks would see this, and it does make me ponder, "Where is the church in all of this, and why does the church look a lot different now than what we read in the Gospels?"

Give some thought to Eph. 6:19, when Paul was in prison and wrote to the Ephesian church, *"Pray also for me that whenever I open my mouth, words may be given to me so that I will fearlessly make known the mystery of the gospel."* Notice that Paul here didn't ask, "Get me out of here, this place is terrible," but rather for boldness in sharing the gospel. Paul knew that knowing and sharing Christ was eternal, and being behind those prison walls was just temporary. Even if he didn't get released, Paul knew without a doubt where his eternal home was.

This is where the church needs to be. I don't mean in prison, but being bold in our faith. Everything else is just temporary, and according to the Gospels, this is where the focus of the church should be, sharing Christ with boldness!!

At a recent cowboy church, I used my saddle to illustrate how it was a picture of a church. I had the opportunity to help build my saddle back in 2000, when I traveled out to Morlach, SK, where a friend was building them. I have spent a considerable of time on my handmade saddle since then and truly enjoy it. The saddle looks good and is very comfortable, but it was built to be a saddle for work. When we go to church, we clean up so we look good, and we do like to be comfortable (not too many old wooden pews anymore). I think a lot of churches have forgotten that the church is meant for work and the sharing of Christ. But once we have attained our own salvation, not much effort is put into evangelizing others.

Let's take a closer look at the church and the saddle because they both have a tree as their foundation. The foundation of our faith is by what Christ did on the cross, as we read in 1 Peter 2:24, *"Who Himself bore our sins in His own body on the tree, that we, having died to sin might live for righteousness by whose stripes you are healed"*. That's our promise, the foundation of our faith. I might add here that the tree in my saddle is well built, and as a result, many cows and calves have been treated and healed because of its solid foundation. A good foundation is the basis for pretty much everything we do and have.

We need to be grounded in our faith, just like the importance of having a good ground seat in your saddle. Have you ever ridden in one of those old high-back saddles? Well, I have one, and it's dreadfully uncomfortable due to the lack of a decent ground seat. Not being grounded in our faith can also cause us to be uncomfortable, especially when it comes to sharing the gospel. The ground seat is built by building it up and/or by skiving it out. Being grounded in our faith builds us up and gives us the confidence to share the gospel, yet at the same time, we all have stuff that the Lord needs to skive away, so we can be more like Him.

When we read and study Gods' word, we are allowing Him to shape and mold us (building up and skiving out) into the person He wants us to be. The more we engage in Gods' word, the more we can discern the truth from the fake. Col. 2:6-7, *"As you, therefore, have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him, rooted and built up in Him and established (grounded) in the faith as you have been taught, abounding in it with thanksgiving"*. Verse 8 warns us not to be taken in by man's traditions but to remain grounded in God's word. We get grounded in our faith when we spend more time in God's word. This allows us to become more comfortable with it and the likelihood that we will share Christ with others more often.

For many Christians, sharing their faith is one of the hardest things for them to do, and I believe this is so because they are poorly grounded. I spent a lot of time just sitting on my saddle while we were building the ground seat, to make sure it was just right. To this day, it's still good, and I believe so because we put a lot of effort into it and took the time that was needed.



When you look at this saddle (or any saddle), all you see is the leather that covers the tree (foundation) as it covers all the work you put into the ground seat.

Some saddles have a lot of tooling and are very showy, not mine, as that wasn't very important to me. My focus was on a good, solid working saddle, which starts with a strong foundation. I think of all this leather as the word. The word of Christ!! John 1:14, "And the word became flesh and dwelt among us."

Reading God's word strengthens and protects us from all the trappings this world uses to destroy our Christian foundation. Without the leather, the tree wouldn't be protected either and would also rot away from the elements.

We are to be a reflection of Christ, but do folks really see Christ living in us? Gal. 2:20, "I have been crucified with Christ, it is no longer I who lives but Christ who lives in me, and the life which I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who loved me and gave Himself for me."

Is that not enough reason to live for Christ and do the work He's called us to? I'm pretty sure we all have family and friends who need to hear the gospel message. It's gonna take some courage, but with a good, strong foundation, it will become easier. Ps 1:6 tells us why this is so important: "For the Lord knows the way of the righteous, but the way of the ungodly shall perish".

How can we be comfortable with that, especially when we know the truth? We can't allow ourselves to become comfortable with them not knowing what Christ has done. Find ways to share Christ and be His witness.

Years ago, we went out to the middle of Saskatchewan to do a cowboy church for a dear and wonderful elderly lady, whom we referred to as "Grandma Anne." She wanted us to come to her yard and share Christ, so her whole family (Family Reunion) could hear the gospel. Grandma Anne was grounded in God's word and knew that the ungodly would perish. She was more than willing to put in the effort so her family would have salvation.

What about us? Are we willing to do the work? As you read this, I hope you find encouragement to go out and share the teachings of Christ. I will continue to pray that you will find comfort and boldness as you go out and do the work of the church.

The Benefits of Giving

Last time, I wrote about peace and joy, but mostly peace that is forced upon people by those in authority over them. This time, I will write about peace through negotiation and deception. The news lately is peace through a negotiated settlement between Israel and its enemies. I can't see how it will ever work because these people are determined to take Israel off the map any way they can; kill them, bomb them, or push them into the Mediterranean Sea. Also, their religion says it's OK for them to tell a lie if it furthers their cause. How can anyone make a deal with people who think like that?

When the Israelites finally made it into the Promised Land, God had told them to destroy all the people living there. They annihilated Jericho and Ai, then deception came, and they were fooled. Joshua 9:3, *"When the inhabitants of Gibeon heard what Joshua had done to Jericho and Ai. They also acted craftily and set out as envoys. They took worn-out sacks on their donkeys, wine skins worn out and torn and mended, and worn-out patched sandals on their feet, worn-out clothes on themselves, and all the bread of their provisions had become dry and mouldy. They came to where Israel was camped and told Joshua and the elders of Israel that they came from a far country and wanted to make a covenant with them."*

Joshua asked them if they lived in the land promised to Israel. They said, "No", but they heard of the fame of the Lord, Israel's God, and all that he had done in Egypt, and how he caused Israel to destroy two Kings, Sihon and Og, who were nations far bigger than them, when they stood in the way for Israel to reach the promised land.

They said their elders told them to take provisions for the journey and make a covenant with Israel. They said their bread was warm when they started their trek; now it was dry and mouldy. They said their wineskins were new, but now they are torn. Their clothes and sandals were worn out because of the long journey. The leaders of Israel looked at them, probably felt sorry for them, but in verse 14, it says they did not ask for the counsel of the Lord. A covenant was made that there would be peace between these two nations.

Three days later, they found out these people were neighbours living in the promised land, so Israel went to look. They came to the cities where these impostors lived, but they did not destroy them because they had sworn to them by the Lord, the God of Israel, that they would not harm them even though they lied about who they were and where they lived. The whole congregation grumbled, but Joshua would not kill them; instead, he cursed them and told them they would always be slaves serving Israel, cutting wood and bringing water for all the people. These people got peace through deception but no freedom.

As I write this, ceasefires and peace treaties are being signed between Israel and its neighbours. In my opinion, they are just a piece of paper that means nothing to those nations. It means nothing to those nations that are determined to destroy Israel. Iran was making nuclear devices they said were for use in their country, but Israel and the United States thought differently when those bunker buster bombs were dropped on those nuclear plants. Guess we really don't know how much damage was done. I think Trump and Netanyahu were not going to be deceived like Joshua and company were thousands of years ago.

In the last days, I think we need to be watchful for deceptive things that will come to deceive us. Matthew 24:24, *"For there shall arise false Christs and false prophets, and shall show great signs and wonders, in so much that, if it were possible, they shall deceive the very elect."* I will end with Colossians 3:15, *"And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which*

The Bible says: The blind see! The lame walk! The deaf hear! The lost are found! The sick are healed! The broken hearts are mended! Dead things are brought back to life!

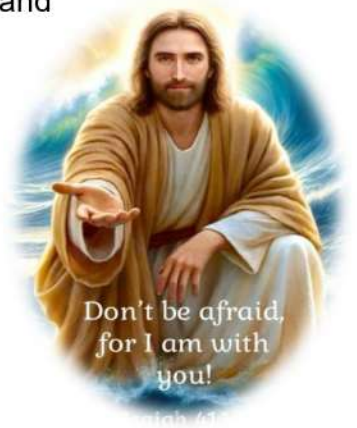

1 Count

Consider (count) it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, Not "If" but "When." John 16:33, *"I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."*

1 Peter 4:12, *"Dear friends, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that has come on you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you."*

2 Know

Because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. 2 Corinthians 4:17, *"For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all."*

3 Let

Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything.

4 Ask

But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt. John 5:13 - 15, *"I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life."* This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. And if we know that he hears us - whatever we ask - we know that we have what we asked of him.

So what is the key to turning trials into triumph?
